

course objectives

Successful completion of the course and examination will enable candidates to:

- Play an active part in monitoring health and safety practices
- Take an active part in some training activities, especially on job training
- Supervise workers effectively in general aspects of health and safety
- Identify the need for risk assessment and participate in the process
- Encourage safe practices
- Assist management in the formulation of health and safety policies and instructions etc.

who is the course for?

Supervisors, owners, team leaders or Managers who are responsible for health and safety

This course is a natural progression for anyone who has achieved the CIEH Level 2 Health & Safety in the Workplace course or equivalent.

duration / format / assessment

Minimum 18 hours training time usually delivered over 3 or 4 days.

Assessment is based on a 2 hour, 60-question multiple choice examination.

This qualification is regulated by the Ofqual

instructor / trainee ratio

Min 1: 6 **Max 1:12**

Larger groups can be accommodated dependant on suitable training venue.

awarding body / certification

Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH)

Candidate's examination papers are submitted to the CIEH by the training centre for marking. Successful candidates will receive the CIEH certification within 4 weeks.
